**Summary of Comments:** Clarification was provided on the submitted parking survey and a parking analysis was submitted that had been carried out between the 17<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> September.

Officer Response: The parking analysis corroborates the findings of the previous parking analysis which was carried out during the school holidays. Whilst the time slots are slightly different to those previously reported, there are only three instances where parking reported during term time was below that of the school holidays and these are as follows:

Tuesday mornings on Holton Road between 7:45 – 8am = 12 spaces during school holidays and 10 spaces during term time

Wednesday mornings on Holton Road between 7:45 – 8am = 12 spaces during school holidays and 9 spaces during term time

Thursday evenings on Beryl Road between 5-5:15pm = 14 spaces during school holidays and 5 spaces during term time


In every other instance, the level of parking available during term time was either identical or higher than that provided during the school holidays. It is therefore considered that there is sufficient parking to meet the demands of the proposed use.



Explanation of Parking Survey Planning application No.2018/00655/FUL



1 Lombard Buildings, Lombard Street, Barry

The parking survey was undertaken to ascertain whether drop off/pick up parking would be available for parents to leave or collect their children from the proposed nursery for 20 children, without putting pressure on the availability of parking in the immediate surrounding area. The immediate surrounding area is taken as the street itself, the bottom of the street, Beryl Road which is accessible via a lane at the side of Lombard Buildings, and the parking bays outside the Job Centre. Kendrick Road car park was not included as though it has a barrier which is in place until 9.30am the barrier is not used and as a result the car park is used by office workers for long term parking.

#### **Summary of Comments:**

Request additional information before any observations can be given. These include:-

- 1 Details of turning facilities to ensure the provision of adequate car parking and manoeuvring facilities are provided within the boundary of the site, in interests of highway safety.
- 2 Appears to be an existing visibility problem with the adjacent access as a fence has been erected over the half near the wall to improve visibility. Visibility splays of 2.4 x 43.0m from the site access along the adjacent highway will need to be provided in accordance with Manual for Streets. This should be shown on a plan to enable further consideration.
- 3 The means of access will need to be constructed as a formal vehicle crossover in accordance with the Councils standard details for adoption.

#### Officer Response:

Bearing in mind the highway comments on previous applications, the appeal decision, and the existing agricultural use, it is not considered that highway safety would be adversely affected by the proposed development and should not be included within the reason for refusal.
