Child tax credit

Child Tax Credit supports families with children. You can claim whether or not you are in work. It may be used to cover your childcare costs, but it is not specifically a payment for childcare.

Your local Family
Information Service can
give you more information
about what you may be entitled
to. They can also signpost you
to other organisations
which may be able
to help.

Working tax credit

Working Tax Credit supports working people (whether employed or self employed) on low incomes by topping up their earnings.

Childcare element of working tax credit

With the Childcare Element of Working Tax Credit you may be able to get extra help with the costs of registered or approved childcare.

Assisted places and helping hands schemes

Some of these schemes provide extra money to support disabled children and children with additional needs with access to childcare provision. These schemes also help families on low income or specific benefits so they can afford quality childcare.

Free part-time early education places

All 3 and 4 year olds in Wales are entitled to free part-time early education places.

Childcare Vouchers

Some employers may support employees by providing them with Childcare Vouchers.

Extra Financial Help

Child Tax Credit can include extra money for disabled children. Working Tax Credit can include help with childcare costs.

Disability Living Allowance can be claimed for a child with a severe physical or mental illness or disability, if, due to their illness, they need much more help or looking after than other children of the same age.

Child Maintenance

Changes to Child maintenance have also been introduced as part of the wider Welfare Reform. Free online advice tailored to your needs is available via the 'Sorting Out Separation' web app. www.sortingoutseparation.org.uk/en/home/

Student Finance Wales

Higher Education students might be eligible for a childcare grant provided they meet the qualifying criteria. Details of which can be obtained from Student Finance Wales (/www.studentfinancewales. co.uk/new-students/201415-what-financial-support-is-available/ extra-support)

Further Education students studying in Wales might be eligible for help with the cost of childcare from the Financial Contingency Fund, which is administered by Further Education institutions on behalf of the Welsh Government.
