This is to facilitate networking and communication between teams from different agencies in a particular area. Managers from the Community Mental Health Team, Children's Services teams and other statutory and voluntary services operating in the area will be invited to nominate staff for the course. Those in the statutory or voluntary sector who do not work with a particular locality focus but provide services across the Counties are welcome to apply for a place on any of the courses. Places on the course are allocated to achieve a balance of participants from various sectors.

Each of the 24 questions will be discussed, exploring how and why these questions should be asked. Attendees will then be given the opportunity to complete their own RIC</li> <li>MARAC – Attendees will be introduced to the aims, processes and procedures of MARAC (including issues around consent and relevant information sharing), enabling them to understand their place within the MARAC process as a whole and to identify with its aims. Attendees will be provided with examples of completed MARAC referrals and will be given the opportunity to complete their own.</li> <li>By the end of the training attendees will: <ul> <li>Understand what makes a client high risk and how to identify them using the CAADA DASH RIC.</li> <li>Know when to MARAC and why</li> <li>Know how to make a MARAC referral</li> <li>Be able to identify relevant information to share</li> <li>Identify with the aims and purpose of MARAC</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
