Vale of Glamorgan - 16%

Four wards where levels exceed 25%

•Butrills – 25%

•Castleland – 32%

•Court - 34%

•Gibbonsdown – 42%

POVERTY KILLS Childhoods

The problem is huge and hidden:

- 3.5million UK children live in poverty – 200,000 in Wales (1 in 3)
- The UK has one of the worst rates of child poverty in the industrialised world
- The majority (59 per cent) of poor children live in a household where at least one adult works.
- The majority of poor children (57 per cent) live in a household headed by a couple.
- Poverty destroys health
- Poverty destroys futures
- It affects everyone:

Poverty costs the economy £25billion a year
