Report Title:	Re- Appointment of Independent Members on the Standards Committee
Purpose of Report:	To seek approval for the re-appointment of three Independent Members on the Standards Committee

Executive Summary:

- Independent Members are Members who are not either a Councillor or an Officer of the Vale of Glamorgan Council or the spouse of a Councillor or an Officer of the Vale of Glamorgan Council or any other relevant Authority as defined by legislation, appointed in accordance with the procedure set out in the Standards Committees (Wales Regulations) 2001 (as amended) and the Standards Committees (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2006.
- Independent Members are appointed for a period of not less than 4 no more than 6 years in accordance with Regulation 18(i) of the Standards Committees (Wales Regulations) 2001 (as amended) as amended by Regulation 28a of the Local Government (Standards Committees Investigations, Dispensations and Referral) (Wales) Amendment Regulations 2016 and may be reappointed for one further consecutive term not exceeding 4 years.

Recommendation

 T H A T the Appointments Committee re Standards Committee consider and approve the re-appointment of Mrs. P. Hallett and Mrs. L. Tinsley from 13th July, 2023 and Mr. R. Hendicott from 31st July, 2023 as Independent Members on the Standards Committee for the next four years.

Reasons for Recommendations

1. Having received confirmation from the three Independent Members that they wish to be re-appointed for one further consecutive term not exceeding four years in compliance with the legislation.

1. Background

- 1.1 The Standards Committee shall be composed of not less than five nor more than nine members. Its membership shall include:
 - (a) Five "independent" members, who are not either a Councillor or an officer or the spouse of a Councillor or an officer of this Council or any other relevant authority as defined by the Act, appointed in accordance with the procedure set out in the Standards Committees (Wales) Regulations 2001 (as amended) and the Standards Committees (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2006.
 - (b) Three Councillors other than the Leader(s) and not more than one member of the Cabinet.
 - (c) One member of a Town or Community Council wholly or mainly in the Council's area (a "Community Committee Member") and who is not also a member of this Council.
- 1.2 Independent Members are appointed for a period of not less than four nor more than six years in accordance with Regulation 18(1) of the Standards Committee (Wales) Regulations 2001, as amended by Regulation 2(8)(a) of the Local Government (Standards Committees, Investigations, Dispensations and Referral) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2016, and may be re-appointed for one further consecutive term not exceeding four years

2. Key Issues for Consideration

2.1 Three Independent Members, namely, Mrs. P. Hallett, Mrs. L. Tinsley were appointed to the Standards Committee on 13th July 2017 and Mr R. Hendicott on 31st July 2017, for a six year term of office. The terms of office are due to expire on 12th July and 30th July respectively, however, all three Independent Members have advised Democratic Services that they are prepared to be re-appointed for one further consecutive term not exceeding four years in accordance with the legislation.

2.2 It is therefore recommended that the three Independent Members referred to above be reappointed as Independent Members to the Standards Committee for a further four years in accordance with the legislation.

3.1 The role of the Standards Committee is to promote and maintain high standards of conduct by Councillors, Co-opted Members and Church and Parent Governor Representatives.
