What is the Children's Partnership?

The Children's Partnership co-ordinates the planning and development of services between agencies for children from 0 – 10 years old. It promotes the need to put children at the centre of planning.



The Children and Young People's Framework states that every child is entitled to:

- a flying start in life and the best possible basis for their future growth and development
- access to a comprehensive range of educational, training and learning opportunities, including the acquisition of essential personal and social skills
- the best possible physical and mental, social and emotional health, including freedom from abuse, victimisation and exploitation
- access to safe play, leisure sporting and cultural activities
- be listened to, treated with respect, and have their race, faith and cultural identity recognised
- enjoy the benefit of a safe home and community that supports physical and emotional wellbeing
- intervention to ensure they are not disadvantaged by poverty

What is the Young People's Partnership?

The Young People's Partnership has been established to meet the requirements of the Welsh Assembly Government's Guidance on "Extending Entitlement" – support for 11 – 25 year olds.



'Extending Entitlement' means that for the first time all young People will be entitled to:

- Personal support and advice
- Advice on health, housing benefits and other issues in accessible and welcoming settings
- Recreational and social opportunities in a safe and accessible environment
- Sporting, artistic, musical and outdoor experiences
- Right to be consulted, to participate in decision making and to be heard on all matters which concern them or have impact on their lives
- Education, training and work experience, tailored to their needs
- Basic skills which open doors to a full life and promote social inclusion
- Wide variety of opportunities to participate in volunteering and active citizenship
- High quality, responsive and accessible services and facilities
- Independent, specialist careers advice and guidance, student support and counselling services

Cymorth – What is it?

Cymorth is a Welsh Assembly Government funding initiative. It builds on the previous funding programmes Sure Start, Children and Youth Partnership Fund, Childcare Strategy, Youth Access and Play Grant.

Cymorth funding is provided to support services to work in partnership to increase opportunities for children, young people and their families by providing Childcare, social, educational or health services.

In addition Cymorth funds projects targeted at improving the life chances of children and young people from disadvantaged families.

There are six Cymorth themes under which funding is allocated:

1. Family Support
2. Health Improvement
3. Play, leisure and enrichment
4. Empowerment, participation and active citizenship
5. Training, mentoring and information
6. Building childcare provision

Beth yw Partneriaeth y Plant?

Mae Partneriaeth y Plant yn cyd-drefnu'r gwaith y bydd asiantaethau'n ei wneud ar y cyd er mwyn cynllunio a datblygu gwasanaethau ar gyfer plant rhwng 0 a 10 oed. Mae'n pwysleisio bod angen i'r plentyn fod yn ganolbwynt y gwaith cynllunio bob amser.



Mae Fframwaith Plant a Phobl Ifanc yn datgan bod gan holl blant y Fro hawl i'r canlynol:

- cychwyn da mewn bywyd a'r sylfaen orau bosibl ar gyfer tyfu a datblygu yn y dyfodol

Beth yw Partneriaeth Pobl Ifanc?

Sefydlwyd Partneriaeth Pobl Ifanc er mwyn ymateb i Ganllawiau Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru ar gyfer "Ymestyn Hawliau" – cymorth i blant a phobl ifanc rhwng 11 a 25 oed.



Mae 'Ymestyn Hawliau' yn golygu y bydd gan pobl ifanc hawl i'r canlynol am y tro cyntaf:

- Cymorth a chynghor personol
- Cynghor am iechyd, budd-daliadau tai a materion eraill mewn lle croesawgar, hawdd ei ddefnyddio
- Adloniant a chyfle i gymdeithasu mewn lle diogel, hawdd ei ddefnyddio
- Cyfle i fwynhau chwaraeon, y celfyddydau, cerddoriaeth a gweithgareddau'n yr awyr agored
- Cyfle i fynegi barn ar faterion sydd o bwys iddynt neu'n effeithio ar eu bywydau ac i fynnu bod y sawl sy'n gwneud y penderfyniadau hynny'n ymgynghori â hwy a'u cynnwys yn y broses benderfynu
- Addysg, hyfforddiant a phrofiad gwaith sy'n bodloni eu hunion anghenion
- Sgiliau sylfaenol sy'n hanfodol ar gyfer byw bywyd llawn a bod yn rhan o'r gymdeithas
- Cyfle i wirfoddoli a gweithredu fel dinesydd o dan bob math o amgylchiadau
- Gwasanaethau o safon uchel sy'n hawdd eu defnyddio ac ar gael bryd bynnag y bo galw amdanynt
- Cynghor ac arweiniad arbenigol ac annibynnol i helpu pobl i ddewis gyrfa, cymorth i fyfyrwyr a gwasanaethau cynghori

Beth yw 'Cymorth'?

Cynllun Ariannu o dan Lywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru yw **Cymorth** sy'n adeiladu ar raglenni blaenorol megis Cychwyn Cadarn, Cronfa Partneriaeth Plant a Phobl Ifanc, Strategaeth Gofal Plant, Mynediad Ieuenctid a Grant Chwarae.

Bydd nawdd cymorth yn cael ei roi er mwyn helpu gwasanaethau i gydweithio a rhoi mwy o gyfle i blant, pobl ifanc a'u teuluoedd drwy ddarparu gwasanaethau cymdeithasol, addysgol, iechyd a Gofal Plant

Bydd arian Cymorth yn cael ei rannu o dan chwe thema sef:

1. Cefnogi Teuluoedd
2. Gwella Iechyd
3. Chwarae, hamdden a chyfoethogi bywyd
4. Galluogi, cyfrannu a dinasyddiaeth weithredol
5. Hyfforddi, mentora a gwybodaeth
6. Datblygu gofal plant
