

# Cadoxton Renewal Area



Declared a Renewal Area in March 1995, with the strategic aim of making 'comprehensive and sustainable improvements to the housing, socio-economic and environmental conditions within Cadoxton'.

Funded by a cocktail of grants from the Vale of Glamorgan Council, Welsh Assembly Government, Private Sector, Welsh Development Agency and Heritage Lottery Fund.

- A Council owned site off Quarella Street, Barry has been identified for a new multi-use sports area, which will include a five-a-side football pitch and basketball court;
- Partnership project involving the Council, individual residents, youth development workers, sports development workers and the police;
- The scheme will enhance the provision of community facilities and encourage the development of community-led project;
- Residents have successfully raised £30,000 of private funding from Dow Corning and Cabot Engineering plus a £5,000 Kick-Start Community Grant, and £15,000 has been allocated from the Renewal Area monies.
- The Housing Group Repair Scheme has acted as the main tool for regeneration within the Cadoxton Renewal Area;
- The aim of the scheme was to 'efficiently and effectively address the need to reverse the trend of decline to the existing housing stock in the neighbourhood ' and 'to bring down the level of unfit properties to zero by the conclusion of the Renewal Area;'
- There has been £4 million investment on Group Repair and £1.5 million investment on renovation works;
- Partnership project involving the Vale of Glamorgan Council, Care & Repair, Age Concern and Health through Warmth.
