

Victoria Park Restoration



- Victoria Park serves the community of Cadoxton. The park has suffered damage through vandalism and a programme of improvements coupled with proactive park management will help in raising the standard of the park to a level comparable to that achieved across Cadoxton, through the renewal programme;
- The aim of the project is to restore the original quality and feature of the park, revitalising the park as an important community space and providing new community features including a new play area and sports facility;
- It is proposed to complete the full park restoration by Spring/Summer 2006;

- **The proposed restoration includes:**
 - Reinstatement and recreation of park boundary railings, walls and gateways;
 - Reinstatement and reconstruction of the central bandstand, a central focus to the park;
 - Remodel the children's play area with new play equipment;
 - Construct a new sports multi-court;
 - Refurbish and rebuild the bowls shelter adjacent to the Bowls Club Pavilion;
 - Construct a new Park Manager's office, including a public toilet, office, meeting room and workshop;
 - Replace the park seats to the original design;
 - Replace the drinking fountain structure; and
 - Recreate Victorian bedding and shrubbery.
- A 73% Heritage Lottery Fund grant was secured for the £1.7 million scheme. The remainder of the funding was sought from the Vale of Glamorgan Council, Welsh Development Agency, and private sector funding.
