

What is the Imagination Library?

- Community sponsored book gifting programme for children aged 0-5
- A new age-appropriate book sent in the post every month, personalised with the child's name
- Inspires a life-long love of reading
- Creates a home library of up to 60 quality books
- Helps ensure that children are prepared for school and eager to learn
- Promotes parent-child interaction, bonding and wellbeing

Strengthens the literacy levels of your community




Imagination Library

- Almost 700,000 books delivered each month
- 1,600 participating communities in 3 countries (USA, Canada, UK)
- Nearly 40 million books have been delivered since 1996

Imagination Library in the UK

- Launched in December 2007 by Dolly in Rotherham, South Yorkshire
- Now in 25 communities across UK
- Over 18,000 books delivered each month
- 500,000 books have been delivered in UK
- Continued growth and expansion is our aim!



How can communities get involved?

- Set up your own Imagination Library for children in your area – any size of geographically identifiable community
- Form local partnerships: Local Authorities, private companies, Children's Centres, trusts/foundations, Rotary Clubs etc...
- Raise money to pay for the books and postage
- Encourage parents to enroll their children and read with them




What is the cost?

£2 per book including postage and packaging

£24 per child per year
£120 per child for 5 years

Dollywood Foundation covers all the overhead, operational and database costs




What will it involve?

- Fundraising & local promotion to encourage uptake
- Partnership working with local agencies/service providers and early years settings
- Strategic function link Imagination Library with other existing family literacy interventions. Offer parents help.
- Administrative function receive registration forms and input data on Imagination Library database.

Why is this programme important?

Poor literacy affects millions of children and adults in UK

- 15% of adults read below the level expected of an 11 year old = approximately 5.1 million adults (BIS Skills for Life Survey, 2011)
- 1 in 3 children do not own a book (National Literacy Trust 2011)
- Literacy issues can limit opportunities in later life (Literacy Changes Lives Report, National Literacy Trust, 2008)

Reading for pleasure is the most important indicator of a child's future success (OECD, 2002)


Impact from early years

- Reading books helps essential early brain development
- 90% of brain growth is achieved in the first 3 years of life
- Reading with a parent or guardian helps a child to develop healthy physical and emotional responses
- Early experiences of family relationships help to shape adult patterns of employment, health and parenting decisions – reading is an important part of those early experiences
