Re-Launch of the Disability Index

The Vale of Glamorgan Council is required to have a Disability Index which is a register of children and young people with disabilities and additional needs in the Vale of Glamorgan. The object of the Disability Index is for social services, education and health to work together to help monitor service provision and provide a needs lead service.

The Disability Index is being supported by Families First Grant funding to help better coordinate disability services.

One key aim of the Disability Index is to work alongside parents/carers by providing them with information about services that are already available and to give parents /carers the opportunity to discuss their needs and suggestions to help improve the planning and co-ordination of services. Children with Disabilities and additional needs, parents and carers are invited to attend the Launch where there will be a whole host of different organisations, from health, voluntary agencies, charities and support services in attendance for any advice or questions that you may have. Children and young people will be entertained by a variety of activities including arts and crafts, boccia, tennis, basket ball and other activities.

The aim of the Launch is to give families information of what's going on in the Vale and to get as many names signed up to the register as possible. Your child does not have to be known to social services, nor receive support to be included on the Index. It is important that we get as many names signed up to the register as possible in order to get better services for the person you care for. The Index is confidential and is held on a secure database.

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An event has been planned to Re-Launch the Disability Index 18th April 2012, at The Hub from 11am-3pm.

Disability Sport in the Vale

A variety of disability sports activities are taking place during the Easter holidays. See below for contact details. There will be two football sessions taking place on Monday April 16th and Tuesday April 17th at Cadoxton Primary School Sports Hall from 10am – 12pm. The cost will be £2.50 per day. If you require one to one assistance this has to be provided by a parent or guardian and there will not be a nurse on site to administer medication. If you would like a registration form then please contact me on the details provided.

I am Simon Jones, the Disability Sport Wales Development Officer for the Vale of Glamorgan Council and my aim is to set up more opportunities for disabled people of all ages to take part in Sport and Physical Activity.

Disability Sport Wales is the National Governing Body for Disabled Sport in Wales and work alongside many other National Governing Bodies to produce more high quality sporting opportunities for disabled people.

I work in the Sports Development team based at the Dock Offices in Barry. From here I can link in with all the other sports development officers so we can offer inclusive sport opportunities.

The Disability Sport Wales programme offers community sport clubs throughout the Vale. There are a number of different sports that disabled people can get involved with ranging from light exercise in the leisure centres, Dance, Kayaking, Football and many more. If you are interested in finding out more about the Sports clubs in the Vale please visit either www.disability-sport-wales.org or www.valeofglamorgan.gov.uk. All the community sport clubs are very welcoming and always have a good atmosphere throughout the sessions, all you have to do to attend is fill out a registration form and you are ready to get involved.

Through working with the Play department we offer holiday Sport and Play programmes that are open for disabled children. Personal care and one to ones can be offered depending on what event is taking place. The marketing for each event will let you know what is available for your child.

My aim for the next year or so is to get more sport clubs in the Vale of Glamorgan to become inclusive so there will be a wide range of sports available throughout the whole authority.

I am always on the look out for volunteers to help with the Disability Sport Clubs. Through volunteering you can gain experience in sport and gain sporting qualifications to help you with the volunteering or coaching. Rainbow Pop-In and Play Group

Rainbow is for pre school children, who live in Barry with special and additional needs, to attend with their parents. The group meets every Wednesday during term time from 1:00 – 2:30 pm at the Flying Start Family Centre on Gladstone Road.

There is a different theme every week which includes age and stage appropriate toys to suit every child's individual needs as well as a craft activity. Specialist play equipment is provided that is often very expensive for families to purchase.

It is a supportive group who always welcome new families. Parents have an opportunity to meet other parents who have had similar experiences. Advice and support for parents is also available from the professionals who run the group.

Toy Library

This is of huge benefit to these children as it gives them the opportunity to use play equipment that meets their needs, assisting their holistic development and enabling them to reach their full potential. This equipment is often very expensive and it can often be a case of trialling several pieces of equipment with a child to see what is suitable for them.
