Vale Youth Service

Vale Youth Service have a number of youth clubs across the Vale of Glamorgan, all are free to access and take part in what's happening each evening. It ranges from sports, informal discussions, films, arts and crafts, pool, chilling out with friends, a place to meet which is warm and dry, education sessions, cooking, DofE Award Scheme, ACU- which is accredited courses where you take part and get accredited for your learning, volunteering opportunities, in house training, participation projects that give you the opportunity to have your voices heard. They also have a mobile youth provision which is their bus called the VPOD that can travel to an area to offer youth activities.

Any young person age 11-17yrs living in the Vale of Glamorgan can access them. Young people age 18-25 can access specific projects for this age range.

Vale Youth Speak Up is a group for young learning disabled children and young people aged between 16-25. They have recently been speaking about their rights and the UNCRC. They have covered Identity and Nationality, Right to inclusion and are going to be looking at Nutrition and Health over the next few sessions. The group aims to highlight and tackle the issues of discrimination and bullying facing young people with disabilities. A major objective of the project is to empower and facilitate young people's involvement in decision making processes. The group has used innovative methods to send the message that people with disabilities can excel when they are listened to and given the right support.

Community Connectors


Three Neurodevelopmental Community Connectors have joined Cardiff and Vale University Health Board's Neurodevelopmental Service as part of a pilot project funded by Welsh Government grant funding.

These roles are to support families of children aged 0-7 years who are waiting for a neurodevelopmental diagnosis by improving the experience families have while they wait, ensuring families can access the support they need, when they need it. Practically the role will be to help families navigate the complex neurodevelopment system by listening to what matters to families and connecting them to support that meets their family's needs.

The Community Connectors will start this through running information sessions for parents and carers of children on the waiting list, delivered with multi-agency partners to identify where support may be available for families to access.

HAPI (Happy, Aspiring, Prosperous & Inclusive)

The Hapi Cardiff and Vale project is into its second year after launching in May 2021. The project is hosted by Newydd Housing Association and funded by Cardiff and Vale University Health Board.

They look to increase the physical activity levels and healthy eating habits of those residents living in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan. The project offers a range of FREE physical activity and healthy eating activities to get involved in, such as exercise classes, walking projects, nutrition and cooking courses. The project is open to anyone living within Cardiff and the Vale, with a particular focus on those living in areas of deprivation that may have barriers accessing these types of activities. They have worked with individuals, community groups, families and schools and can tailor sessions to meet need. They have recently started Additional Learning Needs sessions, as well as within a school in the Vale of Glamorgan.

Seren Dwt is a not-for-profit charitable organisation gifting Welcome Boxes to babies born with Down syndrome across all Health Boards in Wales. The box celebrates their arrival and signposts families to local and national support groups and charities. Families are gifted the box in hospital when baby is born.

Seren Dwt hold a monthly meet up group in North Cardiff, South Wales, for 0-5-year-olds and their parents/carers as well as meet ups for all families during the school holidays, throughout South Wales.

Time Away

Time Away are a registered charity who source vacant time in self-catering holiday accommodation and gift it to those who need a break. Through providing the opportunity for a break away from the home environment they can help families to enjoy time together away from it all. Holidays can be offered as a respite for parents/legal guardians for those who can source childcare aswell as for families together.

Eligibility Criteria:

- You are a parent or legal guardian of a child under the age of 5 with a life changing diagnosis
- That child is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (higher rate award of the care component)

Additional Learning Needs Education Tribunal Wales Update

The additional learning needs (ALN) system supports children and young people aged 0 to 25 in Wales with ALN. The Welsh Government aims to ensure all learners with ALN are supported to overcome barriers to learning and can achieve their full potential.

Changes to ALN implementation timeframe

The Minister for Education and Welsh Language has announced the decision to extend the implementation period of the ALN Act from three years to four years.

This means that children who were due to move to the ALN system between September 2023 and August 2024, will now move to the ALN system between September 2023 and August 2025. The rights for children, and their parents, to request a child moves to the ALN system is unaffected.

Transition

Celt+ Project, a Communities 4 Work Employability project

Celt+ are an employability project for those who live in the Vale of Glamorgan that feel they need support to return to employment, with training or with work experience. They work with young people 16+ with health issues that limits their employment choices. Currently working with pupils and families from Ysgol Y Deri Special School to support them with their employment choices once they finish school.

They can offer:

- Free support with job searching, training, creating or updating CVs.
- Help with work experience placements and work trials.
- Help with managing health issues and move people closer to returning to employment.
- Act as mentor in employment.

Celt+ also offers support for 25+ in wider Vale into training or employment. Eligibility: economically inactive, long term unemployed or those with long-term health issues. They also have a focus on the over-50 age group looking to return to work or at risk of or who have recently left the workforce and dropped into economic inactivity.
