

## You have received an A4 letter on GREEN paper known as the Canvass Communication A form.

Please check your form and the details for accuracy.

If you need to make any amendments to the form, for example add or delete an elector you will need to do the following:

- Go online at [www.registersecurely.com/VoG](http://www.registersecurely.com/VoG) enter your unique security code 1 and 2 which can be found on the A4 letter and make any amendments.

Please note that you will NOT receive an envelope to reply. We require you to respond electronically. If you have any difficulties using the above service, please telephone 01446 729552 and speak to a member of the Electoral Registration Team.

If you have amendments to make to your CCA form, please make sure you reply by **1<sup>st</sup> August 2025**.

Please remember that due to the changes in legislation 14–16-year-olds can now be added to the Register in readiness to vote when they turn 16. They will only be able to vote in some elections, not all elections.

The way to apply for postal votes has now changed. You can now choose to vote by post or proxy for either Reserved (UK Parliamentary and Police and Crime Commissioner Elections), Devolved (Senedd and Local Elections) or all elections. You will need to provide a national insurance number for Reserved polls. By marking the canvass form with a yes or no for a postal or proxy we can send you a paper postal or proxy application. Or you can now complete a postal or proxy application online for Reserved (UK Parliamentary and Police and Crime Commissioner) elections only by going to [www.gov.uk/apply-](http://www.gov.uk/apply-)

[postal-vote](#) or [www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote](http://www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote) . You will still need to complete a paper application for Devolved (Senedd and Local) elections.

It is an offence for an individual to fail to notify us of a change or to provide false information in response to the Canvass forms.
