WESTERN VALE PRIMARIES



Llancarfan and

St David's Church in Wales primary schools are progressing well on site with main contractor ISG.

The steel frame is up at St David's, the windows are being installed and internal works are underway. The steel frame is being installed at Llancarfan and once complete, works will start on the roof and installing the first and second floor.

Work on this project will continue until autumn 2021 and these will be the Vale's first low and net-zero carbon in-use primaries.



Both projects

are ramping up their community support efforts. The sites have been collecting food donations to give to Llamau and Cardiff Foodbank, ISG is also planning on showcasing career opportunities in the construction industry to pupils, working alongside Careers Wales to demonstrate what a great sector it is to work in.

Barry-based CASS scaffolding, with support from contractors Morgan Sindall and Bouygues UK, has set up the first scaffolding training centre in Wales with the **Construction Wales Innovation** Centre. The course is fully funded by the Construction Industry Training Board and will take learners through an 18-month structured learning programme in Swansea. The apprentices will gain hands on experience on the Whitmore and Pencoedtre High School projects.

One apprentice said of the scheme: I'm just pleased to be offered a chance to have stable employment with the opportunity to save for a car and learn a trade in the correct environment.



Project Progress Site works are progressing well, the focus for 2021 is to deliver the complicated remodelling and refurbishment work of the internal spaces without affecting the delivery of lessons.

Works on the new kitchen extension, pupil entrance and staircase are ongoing. When complete these additions will link all parts of the school together for the first time.







Contractor ISG has been busy helping Gwaun-Y-Nant primary school. With the help of local contractor Landcraft, the site team spent two days on the school grounds, clearing the overgrowth and breathing life back into its wildlife area. This area will be used for exciting outdoor education, supporting pupil wellbeing and knowledge of the natural world.



Site works are flying along Project Progress with roofing and cladding now underway and windows are being fitted, giving an indication of what the finished building will look like. One of the last concrete pours was completed in early March, with the sports hall floor due for completion in April. Internal works have started including internal walls and sprinkler system installation.

Community Support

Contractor Bouygues UK has launched a joint initiative with the Cardiff Blues Community Foundation at Pencoedtre High School. The TACKLE programme is a sports engagement programme with workshops to engage, inspire and motivate young people through an alternative curriculum.



The first cohort of pupils are currently undertaking an eightweek programme, which includes practical and classroombased sessions, as well as the completion of an Agored Cymru qualification. The project will engage around 100 pupils and feedback so far has been very positive.



Project Progress

Construction of the brandnew school building is almost complete. The final touches

are being now put into place so this amazing new school can be handed over to staff and pupils. The next phase of work will then begin which will include demolition of the old buildings and creation of new sports pitches.



Contractor Morgan Sindall has been working with Palmerston Centre for Lifelong Learning to help them improve their outdoor spaces.





The team upgraded a path and built some impressive accessible raised planters, complete with safety fence. This will be a great outdoor space for those using the centre and the team look forward to seeing what they grow!
