This course will explain how your Challenge Adviser will inform you as governors about your school data profile, target setting, value added performance, teacher assessment, pupil progress at Key Stages 1,2 & 3 and self evaluation. It will explair how self reflection and professional challenge within schools can be improved through the use of this data and the benefits of robust target setting leading to improved learner outcomes and wellbeing. Implementation of the new system will commence in September 2020 with completion expected by the end of 2023.  The Welsh Government is supporting the transformation of the new system through five key themes:  • Legislation and statutory guidance  • Workforce development  • Implementation and transition support  • Awareness raising  • Supporting policy  This session will provide an opportunity for governors to develop their understanding of the implications of the ALNET Act for schools and loca authorities and what progress has been made within the region against the five key themes. 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Wednesday 13 March 6.00-8.00pm Committee Room 2, Civic Offices, Barry	Internet Safety Awareness	This training will provide Governors with a background understanding of Internet safety, along with the implications this can have within the school environment. The course will have the following objectives:  Brief overview of Internet safety;  Discussion of 360o Safe Review Tool and current position within the local authority along with links to Estyn inspections;  Identify responsibilities for Internet safety within schools, looking at policies in place, confirmation of reviews, ways of holding schools to account and questions to ask of your school's senior leadership team; and  Discussion of further resources available to schools and inform of future training. Tuesday 19 March 6.00-8.00pm Committee Room 2, Civic Offices, Barry	United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)	This training will provide school governors with information about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), an international convention that sets out the rights of children. Governors will increase their knowledge of the rights of children and young people; and familiarise them with the duties that schools have if enabling children and young people to access their rights. The training will also include information about the newly revised National Participation Standards for Children and Young People and the role of the Children's Commissioner for Wales.  Trainer: Ve Van der Voode, Youth Participation Officer and Alex Thomas, Youth Action Worker/Rights Ambassadors Project Worker
Thursday 11 April 6.00-8.00pm Corporate Suite, Civic Offices, Barry	Safeguarding Children and Child Protection	The Education Act 2002 creates a statutory requirement for school governing bodies to safeguard and promote the welfare of children.  The All Wales Child Protection Procedures 2008 set out the responsibilities of everyone who has concerns about the welfare of a child, including the responsibility to ensure that concerns are referred to social services or the police. This training will explore the legislative and guidance framework for safeguarding children, in order to promote clarity and consistency of practice and common standards in all schools.  The session will set out the role and responsibilities of school staff, including the role of the designated Safeguarding governor, in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and protecting individual children from abuse and neglect. Course content will include information relating to risk factors for children, definitions and indicators of abuse and neglect, current themes in child protection, identifying significant harm, acting on suspicions, making referrals and the child protection process.
