<p><b>Induction</b></p> <p>Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> January 17:30-19:00</p> <p>Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> March 16:00-17:30</p>	<p>This revised <b>mandatory module</b> is aimed at new governors and must be completed within the first year of appointment It will help new governors gain the required knowledge and understanding to begin to fulfil their role effectively to support their school in raising standards.</p> <p><b>The training session will focus on:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How the school vision shapes values across the school community and drive a culture of high expectations</li> <li>• The key roles and responsibilities of governors</li> <li>• The composition of governing bodies and how they work</li> <li>• Effective challenge and support.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Data</b></p> <p>Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 16:00-17:30</p> <p>Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> March 17:30-19:00</p>	<p>This updated <b>mandatory module for new governors</b> aims to develop an understanding of school progress and performance data.</p> <p><b>The session explores:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The type of data used by schools and the role data plays in school improvement</li> <li>• How data can be used by governors to challenge and support the school to improve</li> <li>• How governors are accountable for the progress made by all groups of learners how this data is gathered and used by their schools</li> <li>• The type of questions governors can ask about their own schools data</li> </ul>
<p><b>Redundancy</b></p> <p>Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> February 17:30-19:00</p>	<p>This course will cover the role of the governing body within the Council's recommended Redundancy policy. It aims to fully familiarise governors with the recommended Redundancy policy and procedures.</p> <p>It is particularly relevant for governors who are members of the staff disciplinary and dismissal and disciplinary and dismissal appeals committees as well as the finance committee.</p>
<p><b>Pastoral Support Plans (PSP's)</b></p> <p>Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> February 17:30-19:00</p>	<p>The Pastoral Support Plan (PSP) in Wales is designed to support students facing barriers to education, aiming to improve their social, emotional, and academic outcomes. The PSP is a short term (6-8 weeks), school-based, child-centred approach aimed at helping children and young people (CYP) who encounter challenges such as poor attendance, behavioural issues, or academic difficulties.</p> <p>The plan serves as an early intervention tool to prevent exclusion from school and to support students in achieving better educational outcomes.</p> <p><b>The aims of this training are to support governors to be confident to understand the following.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What are Pastoral Support Plans?</li> <li>• What is Flexi-learning?</li> <li>• What is the underlying legislation?</li> </ul>

<b>Internet Safety</b>  Monday 2 <sup>nd</sup> March 17:30-19:00	<p>This training will provide governors with a background understanding of Internet safety, along with the implications this can have within the school environment. The course will have the following objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Brief overview of Internet safety;</li> <li>• Discussion of 360o Safe Review Tool and current position within the local authority along with links to Estyn inspections;</li> <li>• Identify responsibilities for Internet safety within schools, looking at policies in place, confirmation of reviews, ways of holding schools to account and questions to ask of your school's senior leadership team; and</li> </ul> <p>Discussion of further resources available to schools and inform of future training.</p>
<b>Disciplinary Procedures</b>  Wednesday 4 <sup>th</sup> March 17:30-19:00	<p><b>The purpose of this briefing session is to:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• provide an overview of the Vale of Glamorgan Council's School Disciplinary Procedures that all governing bodies should have adopted;</li> <li>• remind governors of the principles of a fair process; and</li> <li>• clarify roles and responsibilities of Headteachers and governors in the disciplinary process</li> </ul> <p><i>This course is particularly relevant to all governors on the staff disciplinary and dismissal and disciplinary and dismissal appeals committees of the governing body.</i></p>
<b>Attendance and Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN's)</b>  Tuesday 10 <sup>th</sup> March 17:30-19:00	<p>This session is aimed at supporting governors to know how to support school and LA approaches in encouraging positive attendance and engagement. It will look at penalties and support for non-attenders and the crossover with potential mental health needs linked to anxious and phobic attenders and how schools and the LA support these needs. It will cover the cross over into other areas such as Pastoral Support Plans (PSPs) and Additional Learning Needs (ALN) issues and will look at referral pathways and will signpost and provide resources.</p> <p>Governors will be supported with information on policies and guidance, including Welsh Government updates to enable them to act as critical friends in terms of supporting their SLT with quality assurance and audits in this area.</p>
<b>Diversity and Anti-Racist Professional Learning (DARPL)</b>  Monday 16 <sup>th</sup> March 17:30-19:00	<p>This Governors workshop will unpick anti-racism and explore actions that can be taken at a strategic senior level. This session looks at organisational culture, the impact of racism on the well-being and lives of Black, Asian and other Minority Ethnic people and at policies and procedures that may adversely affect those from non-White backgrounds.</p> <p>It's important that anti-racism is driven at a strategic level, to ensure that all educational settings affect positive change and improvement.</p>
<b>Designated Safeguarding Governors (DSG's)</b>	<p>It is Vale Policy that all Designated Safeguarding Governors (DSGs) renew their training bi-annually. This course covers the expectation of the role, provides an understanding of the Keeping Learners Safe (KLS) Toolkit and itemises how to evidence accountability to Estyn for</p>
