

**Shared Regulatory Services – Cardiff, Vale of Glamorgan & Bridgend Council.
Performing Animals – Conditions of Licence**

Version 1 updated 14.2.23

1. All animals to which this certificate relates must:
 - a) Be provided with a suitable diet;
 - b) Be provided with a suitable and adequate environment (may vary depending on weather conditions and requirements of individual species);
 - c) Be protected from pain, injury, disease and suffering;
 - d) Be allowed to exhibit normal behaviour; and
 - e) Have the freedom to live with or apart from other species as applicable to species.

2. This certificate of registration or a copy of it must be available and produced for inspection at all exhibitions or any other time when it may be requested by an authorised officer.

3. Hand washing facilities/hand sanitising facilities must be available at all times where animals may be handled.

4. No one under the age of 16 is to be left in charge or left responsible for any registered animals at any time.

5. No member of the public is to be left unattended with any registered animal at any time.

6. No animal which is suffering from, or could reasonably be suspected of having come into contact with any other animals suffering from any infectious disease, which may be a risk of being transferred to humans or any other animals, shall be used in any exhibitions. It must be transferred to isolation facilities and all necessary precautions must be taken to prevent the spread of infectious or contagious disease. N.B: Veterinary advice must be sought as a matter of urgency should any infectious or contagious disease be suspected.

7. In the case of an animal suffering from, or coming into contact with another animal suffering from an infectious disease which may be transferrable to humans, you must inform the Licencing Authority at the earliest convenience.
8. Where animals are kept in cages, hutches, boxes or other receptacles placed on top of other cages, hutches, boxes or receptacles , effective means shall be provided for prevention of water, food or excreta falling onto, or contaminating the animal(s) or their surroundings which are underneath. Appropriate ventilation must always be available and adequate as required for the species.
9. All records must be retained for each individual registered animal/species:
 - a) The number of animals;
 - b) Acquisitions, births, deaths, sales and any escaping of animals;
 - c) Any breeding details;
 - d) The cause of any death as well as any collection of fallen stock; and
 - e) The on-going health and any veterinary dealings/treatment of the registered animals.
