Executive Summary:			

• Menter Bro Morgannwg have been providing Welsh language services on our behalf since 2016. It is proposed to extend the agreement for another three years from October 2019 to September 2022

Recommendations

- It is recommended that Cabinet approves the further allocation of funding for Menter Bro Morgannwg of £17k in 2019/20, £34K in 2020/21, £34k in 2021/22 and £17k in 2022/23.
- 2. It is recommended that delegated authority is given to the Section 151 Officer in consultation with the Leader and Monitoring Officer / Head of Legal and Democratic Services to enter into a service level agreement outlining the services to be provided and appropriate performance targets and monitoring arrangements.

Reasons for Recommendations

- **1.** To award monies to Menter Bro Morgannwg to deliver the services outlined in Appendix A.
- **2.** To ensure appropriate performance management arrangements are put in place and executed in line with the Council's constitution.

1. Background

1.1 Menter Bro Morgannwg is an organisation that aims to promote and expand the use of the Welsh language throughout the Vale of Glamorgan, an aim the Council has also explicitly set for itself in its Corporate Plan. The organisation is part of a national network of Mentrau laith (Welsh Language Initiatives) funded by Welsh Government and local authorities. In order to promote and support the Welsh language, the Vale of Glamorgan Council has been working with the organisation since 2016. A Service Level Agreement has been in place between the Council and the organisation against which performance is regularly monitored and reviewed. Funding has been provided in association with the SLA at the level of £34,000 per annum. Current funding was previously agreed by Cabinet and comes to an end at the end of September 2019.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

- 2.1 The current Menter Bro Morgannwg funding was awarded by Cabinet on 3rd October 2016. The funding consisted of a three year allocation of £17k in 2016/17, £34k in 2017/18, £34k in 2018/19 and £17k in 2019/20.
- 2.2 It is proposed to continue to award funding to Menter Bro Morgannwg for a further three year period, starting in October 2019. A revised Service Level Agreement has been discussed with Menter Bro Morgannwg and the relevant Council services are attached at Appendix A for approval. The funding allocated

will be profiled as follows: £17k in 2019/20, £34k in 2020/21, £34k in 2021/22 and £17k in 2022/23.

- 3. How do proposals evidence the Five Ways of Working and contribute to our Well-being Objectives?
- **3.1** Long Term The work of Menter Bro Morgannwg is helping the Council to fulfil it's 5 year Promotional Strategy
- **3.2** Prevention The work that Menter do within the Vale ensures that we comply with Welsh language legislation
- **3.3** Integration The achievement of the Welsh language promotional strategy is included in the Corporate Plan.
- **3.4** Collaboration Menter Bro Morgannwg is one of the key partners involved in achievement of shared goals for the Welsh language.
- **3.5** Involvement We work closely with Menter Bro Morgannwg on a regular basis

4. Resources and Legal Considerations

Financial

4.1 Financial provision has been made within the corporate policy revenue budget in 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22 and 2022/23.

Employment

4.2 Officer time is needed to liaise with Menter Bro Morgannwg, which can be met within existing budgets.

Legal (Including Equalities)

- **4.3** This report recommends that delegated authority is given to the Section 151 Officer in consultation with the Leader and Monitoring Officer / Head of Legal and Democratic Services to enter into a service level agreement outlining the services provided and appropriate performance targets and monitoring arrangements to ensure the provision of services meets the Council's expectations.
- **4.4** Under the Corporate Plan's Well-being Outcome 3: "An aspirational and culturally vibrant Vale" and Objective 6: "Valuing culture and diversity" there is an action: "Work with partners to promote the use of the Welsh language". The work of Menter Bro Morganwwg will assist in meeting these.
