C289 ANNOUNCEMENT –

The Leader welcomed all parties to the Cabinet meeting and reminded everyone present that the meeting was being Live Streamed as well as recorded via the internet and this recording archived for future viewing.

C293 ANNUAL DELIVERY PLAN MONITORING REPORT: QUARTER 3 PERFORMANCE 2022/23 AND PROGRESS AGAINST EXTERNAL REGULATORY RECOMMENDATIONS AND PROPOSALS FOR IMPROVEMENT (EL/PR) (SCRUTINY – ALL) –

The Leader presented the report, the purpose of which was to present Quarter 3 performance results for the period 1st April to 31st December, 2022 in delivering the Council's 2022/23 Annual Delivery Plan commitments as aligned to the Vale of Glamorgan Council's Corporate Plan Well-being Objectives as well as to present progress to date in addressing existing recommendations and improvement proposals from external regulators.

The Leader said that the report had been considered and noted by all five Scrutiny Committees as discussed in paragraph 2.6 of the report.

In terms of what had been achieved, the Leader referred to the Council winning the "Delivering Social Value" award at the Ystadau Cymru awards held in December for its work in partnering with Ogmore by Sea Village Association which was referenced in Appendix B as well as the progress regarding the LED street light conversion programme to increase the percentage of street lights converted to LED as an area of future focus and improvement. Councillor Wilson said that the replacement of Victorian street lights in Penarth had been welcomed.

C294 USE OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S EMERGENCY POWERS (EL/PR) (SCRUTINY – ALL) –

The Leader presented the report, the purpose of which was to notify Cabinet of the exercising of Emergency Powers by the Chief Executive since the last report on 16th March, 2023. The Leader said that many of the uses concerned the accepting of grant funding or agreeing contracts to proceed with matters as soon as possible.

Councillor John referred to the Knap Skate Park and updated Cabinet Members that it was due to be completed in July 2023 which the Leader said was ideal as it would be in time for the school holidays. Also a local organisation would be working with young people to decorate the walls of the Skate Park.

Councillor Wilson referred to the seasonal grass cutting services contract and that some of the work was being financed from Civil Parking Enforcement monies, also grass cutting was only taking place when needed and to encourage biodiversity where possible.

C296 2023 UPDATE TO THE HOUSING SUPPORT GRANT DELIVERY PLAN 2022 -2025 (PSHTE) (SCRUTINY – HOMES AND SAFE COMMUNITIES) –

The Leader presented the report, the purpose of which was to inform Cabinet of the updated Housing Support Grant (HSG) priorities and sought approval for the 2023-24 HSG spend plan.

The Leader referred to emergency accommodation provision, daytime drop in services, mediation services and floating support for a range of people with some examples of what was being provided for residents of the Vale of Glamorgan.

C297 VALE OF GLAMORGAN RAPID REHOUSING PLAN (PSHTE) (SCRUTINY – HOMES AND SAFE COMMUNITIES) –

The Leader presented the report which sought approval of the Vale of Glamorgan Rapid Rehousing Plan. The Leader said the report dealt with some challenging issues because of the pandemic and recent changes to homelessness legislation. It was proposed to refer the report to the Homes and Safe Communities Scrutiny Committee for consideration where the Leader hoped other Cabinet Members would be able to attend and take part in the discussion if the recommendations were agreed.

The Deputy Leader said that while she had been the relevant Cabinet Member in 2012 a great deal of work had been done to reduce and negate the need to use bed and breakfast accommodation, but it was the right time to take the matter to Scrutiny and gather any comments to be referred back to Cabinet as required.

(1&2) To ensure that the Council minimised the use of temporary accommodation and complied with Welsh Government requirements, namely that all Welsh Councils would have in place their own Rapid Rehousing Plan.

C298 VALE OF GLAMORGAN REPLACEMENT LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2021-2036 ISSUES, VISION AND OBJECTIVES BACKGROUND PAPER (CEERS) (SCRUTINY – ENVIRONMENT AND REGENERATION) –

The Cabinet Member presented the report, the purpose of which was to advise Cabinet of the results of the engagement undertaken on the draft Vision and Objectives, and the resultant Issues, Vision and Objective Background Paper and also to seek approval of the paper as part of the evidence base for the emerging Replacement Local Development Plan (RLDP).

Councillor Sivagnanam said that the Planning Policy Team had conducted a review of an extensive evidence base which identified ten themes under which the key issues had been grouped. The RLDP would strive to address and support the challenges, opportunities and ambitions for the Authority across the new Plan period and the objectives would offer greater detail on how the planning system could help achieve the vision and respond to the key issues which needed to be addressed in the Vale of Glamorgan and in line with the Community Involvement Scheme.
