Report Title:	Mural at the Richard Taylor Memorial Skate Park, located at the Knap, Barry
Purpose of Report:	To seek the approval of Cabinet to install a mural at the Knap Skate Park

Policy Framework:	This is a matter for Executive decision by Cabinet
<p>Executive Summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In October 2023, a new Richard Taylor skate park opened at the Knap in Barry. The modern facility, constructed of concrete, replaced a previous composite timber skate park built following the tragic death of Richard Taylor, a young talented skater from Barry who sadly lost his life in a skating accident in Barry in 2004. • The new facility, again built in the memory of Richard, was part funded by the Richard Taylor Memorial fund, a fund set up in Richard's memory to raise money to provide wheeled sport opportunities in the Knap area, particularly for young people. • The skate park is constructed below the level of the adjacent highway and knap terrace/esplanade and bounded to the west by a large supporting wall, which effectively provides a large backdrop to the facility. • In the past this wall has been subject to graffiti, albeit at a relatively low frequency, appearing as it does like a large blank canvas. Graffiti based artwork is synonymous with skating and other wheeled sports and whilst often colourful and of certain artistic value, if uncontrolled can also be 	

destructive, and derisory with personal tags and inappropriate messaging sometimes blighting the space.

- The suggestion for a street art mural emerged from the consultation on the design of the replacement skatepark in September 2022. The thought was that it would, help minimise the risk/impact of tagging graffiti at the site and support the existing sense of ownership by the local community.
- This report details how the proposed mural was designed, how two final mural options were then chosen for public consultation, and the outcome of that public consultation.
- Whilst the outcome of the consultation was largely positive, the report highlights the conflicts of opinion that have arisen between those responding who do not live overlooking the park and several residents that do.
- Noting this position, the report seeks the agreement of Cabinet to progress with a slightly amended mural, giving regard to the comments of nearby residents and other consultees, but also seeking to improve the space and to best protect it from unauthorised graffiti in the future.

Recommendations

1. That Cabinet agrees to the installation of design 2 of the mural at the Richard Taylor Skate Park, Barry as shown in Appendix B to this report.
2. That Cabinet agrees to a slight amendment to the green coloured areas featured in design 2, replacing it with more natural, muted green colour.
3. That delegated authority is granted to the Head of Neighbourhood Services in Consultation with the Cabinet Member for Neighbourhood and Building Services to agree the final design colours.

Reasons for Recommendations

1. To agree the installation of a suitably designed mural at the Knap Skate Park.
2. To ensure that the mural better suits the local environment where it will be located.
3. To ensure that the final green colour is suitably amended based on the negative comments received.

1. Background

- 1.1 The new Richard Taylor Skate Park, located at the Knap in Barry, opened in October 2023. Since then, it has attracted a wide range of users, providing quality opportunities to enjoy a variety of wheeled sports; whilst also significantly reducing excess noise pollution due to its concrete construction.
- 1.2 The Park replaced an older steel frame and composite board skate Park at the site, built in honour of local world inline Skating Champion Richard Taylor who tragically lost his life in a skating accident in 2004.
- 1.3 The Park was constructed at a cost of approximately £400,000 (excluding sewer and access works) and was funded primarily via a grant from Sport Wales for £200,000. Additional funding came from a variety of other sources including the Shared Prosperity Fund and a significant contribution from the Richard Taylor Memorial Fund (RTMF), which included an £81,000 grant from the National Lottery Community Fund.
- 1.4 The National lottery award, secured by the RTMF, covered specific additional elements of the scheme requested by the community during the design consultation which were outside the scope of the original project, and included an additional seating/learn to skate area, the mural and site-specific signage.
- 1.5 The suggestion for a street art mural emerged from the consultation on the design of the replacement skatepark in September 2022. The thought was that it would help minimise the risk/impact of tagging graffiti at the site and support the existing sense of ownership by the local community. It was not proposed as a commemorative piece, the skatepark itself, replacement memorial plaques and the site information signs perform that function. Commemorative elements have however been suggested for inclusion in the design during the ongoing engagement.

- 1.6** The mural was not within the scope of the original project; however, the Richard Taylor Memorial Trust (RTMF) as a key stakeholder in the project, was keen to explore the idea and initial discussions were held with CADW to determine if it was feasible in the context of the Knap Grade II listed park and the fact that this is a Conservation Area. These discussions concluded that it was feasible subject to an appropriate design and colour scheme for the setting.
- 1.7** Funding for the mural was secured from the National Lottery Community Fund in January 2023 and the principle of the mural was included in the planning application submitted on 20th January, 2023 (Application reference 2023/00064/RG3), proposing “Replacement of the existing skatepark with a new concrete wheeled sports facility and alterations to the path layout in Cold Knap Park to improve accessibility” at Cold Knap Gardens, Lakeside, Barry.
- 1.8** Drawings included with the application indicated that ‘a locally themed street art mural to be painted on the remaining top section of the existing retaining wall’.
- 1.9** The Planning consent granted on 20th March, 2023 included the following condition relating to the mural: Condition 3 -Notwithstanding the submitted details, a schedule of materials to be used in the construction of the development (including a colour scheme for the surfaces and enclosures and details of any murals) hereby approved, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority
- 1.10** An engagement activity in the form of a design workshop was organised for 23rd April, 2023 intended to gather ideas for a design. The drop-in event ran for four hours on a weekend afternoon to give residents and visitors to the Knap an opportunity to share their views. The event was successful in reaching more than 22,000 users online with approximately 40 people attending the session, including residents overlooking the park; with views expressed both for and against the idea of a mural.
- 1.11** Various design options were subsequently drawn up, discussed and revised, in association with representatives of the Taylor family working with a group of specialist street artists, in consultation with Cadw’s historic parks officer and the Council’s conservation officer, that both reflected the impact Richard had on the sport, the local setting and the sensitive environment in which the mural would be located.
- 1.12** The resulting design options, that were considered suitable to discharge the relevant planning condition, were then the subject to a public consultation exercise. Details of the designs 1 and 2 are shown at appendix A and B respectively.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

- 2.1** The results of the public consultation exercise conducted to assess the appropriateness of 2 designs for the mural are attached at Appendix C. A copy of the flier advertising the mural consultation is shown at Appendix D.

- 2.2** The results suggest overall strong support for the mural with 70.25% selecting one of the two options presented and 29.75% preferring to not select an option or not answering.
- 2.3** However, given the sensitive nature of the site, when the results are viewed in the context of whether the respondent overlooks the skatepark, i.e. those directly affected by the proposal; the results show a different bias. Of the 65 respondents who overlook the park 66.2% preferred not to select a design and 33.8% selected either option 1 or 2. This would suggest a significant majority of residents directly affected and overlooking the skatepark object to the proposal of either mural design. This is reflected in the additional comments received.
- 2.4** An artist's impression of how the mural could look when viewed across the Knap Gardens is shown at Appendix E.
- 2.5** There has been considerable contact with Knap residents who have raised concerns about this mural, via telephone and in writing. Also, a formal complaint has been received by a resident who has a view of the skatepark from their property, citing problems/errors with the consultation process. A positive outcome for the complainant in this case would have been confirmation that the mural would not be going ahead. This complaint has been investigated and a response provided, though not one to the satisfaction of the resident concerned. This complaint investigation and response did not identify any errors with the consultation process, though the fact that a formal complaint has been raised is mentioned to demonstrate to Cabinet the high level of concern being expressed by several residents of the Knap area.
- 2.6** One point clearly evidenced during the consultation process is the requirement to 'tone down' the green in the proposed designs, and whilst the design process was influenced by the environment where the mural is to be located and consequently sought to avoid the usual quite bright graffiti art colours, there is scope to mute the green tones used down further.
- 2.7** In order to reach a decision as to whether to progress with design 2 of the mural (Appendix B), the most popular design identified via the consultation, it is important to seek to balance and compare the strong opposing views to any mural expressed by a number of residents of the Knap, especially those who will have line of site to the mural across the Knap Gardens; to those who have responded positively to design 2 but do not live within sight of skatepark from their properties.
- 2.8** The provision of a mural was included in the planning application (as detailed above), though no designs were included and the condition associated with this (also detailed above), still needs to be discharged. There were no objections to the planning application
- 2.9** As has previously been stated, the suggestion for a street art mural emerged from the consultation on the design of the replacement skatepark in September 2022. The thought being that it would help minimise the risk/impact of tagging

graffiti at the site and support the existing sense of ownership by the local community.

- 2.10** It is impossible to say with any certainty that the back wall would suffer from unauthorised graffiti should it remain unpainted, or even if a mural is installed, this mural would not suffer the same fate. However, experience of other commissioned public artwork in Barry has shown a reduced risk of tagging and other unauthorised artwork being applied, with the community generally valuing the surface more when it features commissioned street art. It is considered that this 'value' for the artwork proposed could be even higher in this case bearing in mind the memorial nature of the park and the involvement of the local skating community in the design proposed.
- 2.11** There is a fear that should the mural not go ahead, the community, or visitors to the skate park, will simply apply their own uncoordinated artwork in any colour or format, and that, in the worst-case scenario, this could result in competing tags and artwork which overtime could become very unsightly.
- 2.12** The Council has limited resources for the removal of graffiti and tends to only remove it if it is offensive, racist or applied to highway signage and/or infrastructure where it could either compromise road safety or effect traffic movements.
- 2.13** Therefore, should the skate park suffer graffiti, most of it is likely to remain and not be removed. Further, graffiti is often painted over when it is difficult to remove, and this could again result in the skate park back wall becoming unsightly over time.
- 2.14** Another consideration in the decision as to whether to install any of the 2 mural designs must be the views of the Taylor family and the Richard Taylor Memorial Fund trustees, one of the funders of the facility. Both have made it very clear that they see the mural as an integral part of the skate park installation, and this completed facility being a fitting memory to Richard.
- 2.15** As previously advised, the new skatepark is named the 'Richard Taylor Memorial Skate Park' and is a memorial to a cherished Barry skater. The site signage reflects this and includes QR codes with links to information about Richard and his life. A memorial plaque is being prepared for installation on site to also reflect this.
- 2.16** Taking all these factors into account it is suggested that Cabinet agree to the installation of design 2 of the mural (as attached at Appendix B). Though that this be subject to the suitable toning down of the green colour that is most prominent within the designs.
- 2.17** It is further proposed that a delegation is given to the Head of Neighbourhood Services in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Neighbourhood and Building Services to agree the final mural colours.

3. How do proposals evidence the Five Ways of Working and contribute to our Well-being Objectives?

- 3.1** The Skatepark has demonstrated its value in terms of Well-being objectives by providing quality opportunities for recreation for visitors and residents of all ages and abilities.
- 3.2** Long Term – The mural will provide a context to the provision of the Skate Park and what Richard Taylor achieved. It will hopefully also reduce any further graffiti at the site as Richard was respected by the skate community and it is expected that they will value the addition of the mural.
- 3.3** Prevention – The provision of the Skate Park, along with other quality Leisure provision is now recognised as having a positive effect on crime reduction.
- 3.4** Collaboration – the side project of developing the mural proposals has been a collaborative process involving several organisations and was subject to public consultation.
- 3.5** Integration – The Place and Environment and Housing Directorates have worked in partnership to design and build the skate park and the design of the mural has regard for the local environment and the users of the park. The usual graffiti style art of bright colours has been rejected for artwork more in keeping with the environment.
- 3.6** Involvement – The involvement of local skaters and the Taylor family into the design of the Mural was a key element.

4. Climate Change and Nature Implications

- 4.1** There are no Climate Change or Nature Implications associated with this report.

5. Resources and Legal Considerations

Financial

- 5.1** Funding for the installation has been secured as detailed in the report. The National Lottery Community Fund grant awarded to the Richard Taylor Memorial Fund included a budget of 15k for the mural.

Employment

- 5.2** There are no employment implications associated with this report.

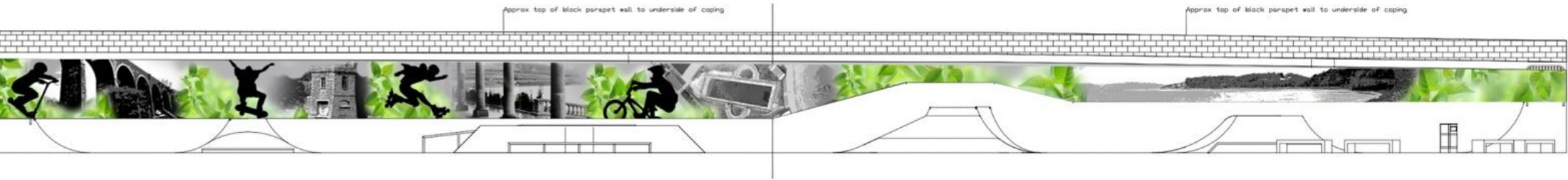
Legal (Including Equalities)

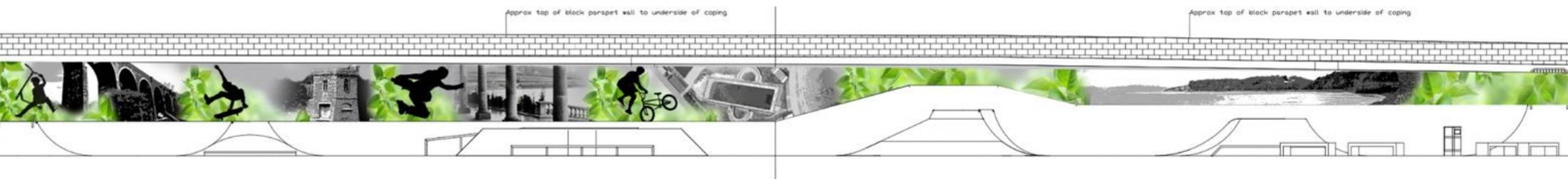

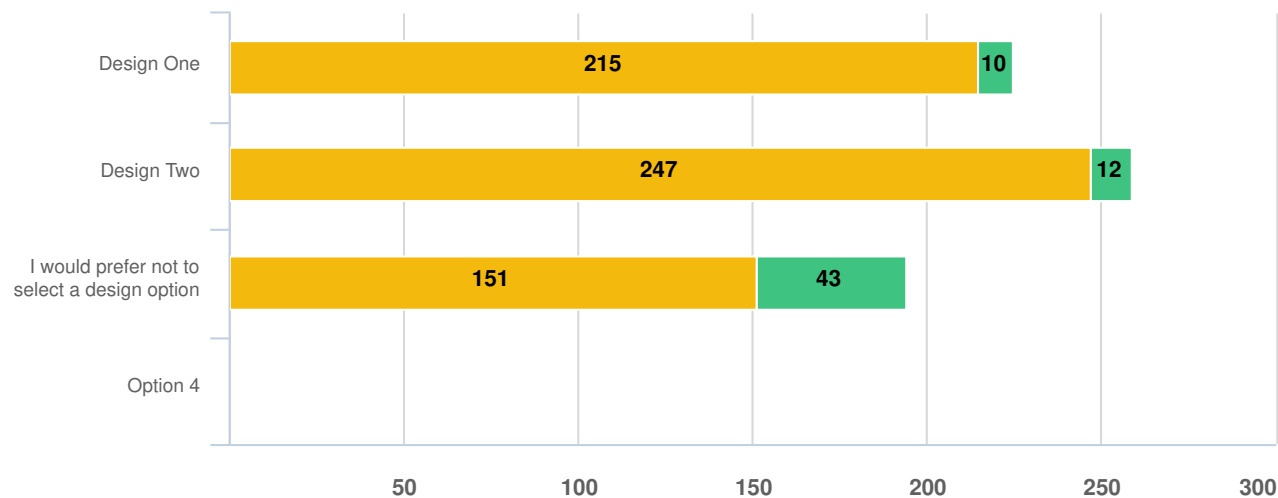

There is no beauty or joy in these designs, and yet these should be essential elements of the design given that the skatepark lies within the Knap Park. The designs are far too urban and harsh and fail to complement and blend in with the natural and muted colours of the Knap Park.

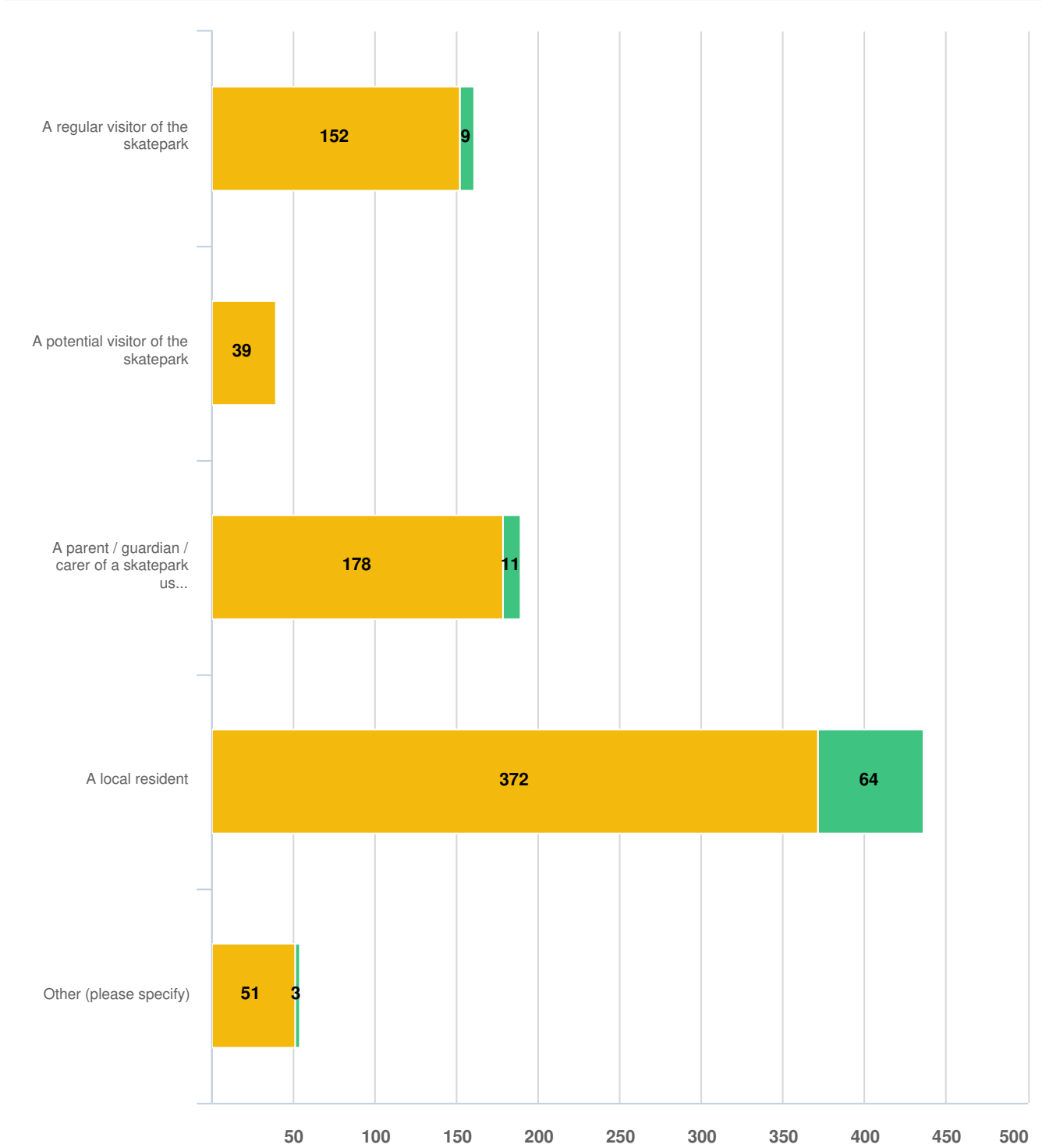

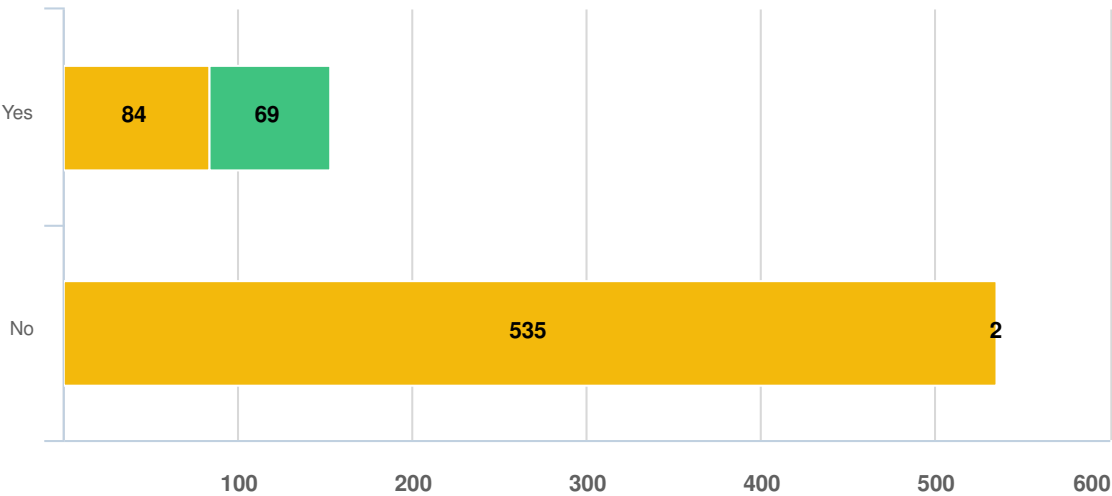

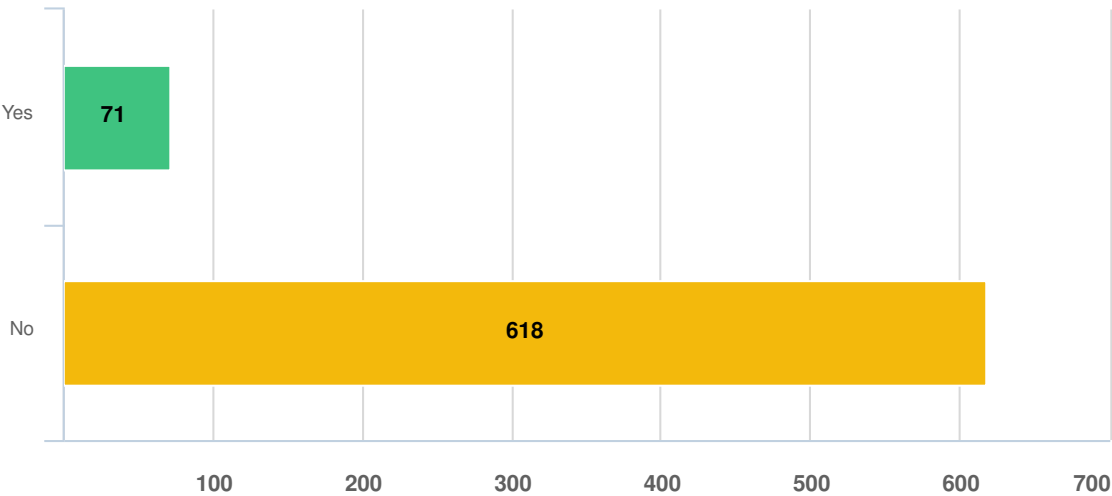
