		SCML have encountered further delays which include:

By using Synergy Construction Management on this scheme and undertaking the works using the Construction Management Contract we have saved approximately £500,000.00 as apposed to using the traditional design and build contract method which was forecasted to cost circa 3.6m.	
Due to the delays mentioned above the development is now due to complete on the 25.7.25 which is 8 weeks from the revised completion date. As the scheme is now 90% complete the development team are of the opinion that no other delays should be encountered that would require any further uplifts.
