- Made up of representatives of the major Public Sector and Community Organisations in the Vale of Glamorgan
 - Vale of Glamorgan Council (Chair)
 - South Wales Police
 - South Wales Fire Service
 - Ambulance Service
 - Cardiff & Vale University Health Board
 - Glamorgan Voluntary Services
 - Cardiff & Vale College
 - Natural Resources Wales
 - Probation Service
 - Community Rehabilitation Company
 - Welsh Government (ad-hoc)
 - Town & Community Council Representative

- Local Service Board operates as a consultative (i.e. non decision making) body

- Guided by The Well Being of Future Generations (Wales) Act
