### 335 REVIEW OF STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES GAMBLING ACT 2005 – 2025-2028 (DEH) –

The report was presented by the Licensing Team Manager, who advised that Section 349 of the Gambling Act 2005 required that a Licensing Authority publish a Statement of Principles governing its licensing policy for a three-year period. The current Statement would expire at the end of 2025.

The report outlined the review and renewal process for 2025-2028 and a report back on the statutory consultation. It detailed the prescribed process to publish the next Statement of Principles including referrals to Cabinet, and finally Council for adoption.
