Destination data

- ▶ The annual destination data published by Careers Wales shows that in 2013/14 the proportion of year 11 leavers who were NEET was 3.8% compared to our target of 3.25%. Whilst performance did not meet the target, it was a slight improvement on our performance of 3.9% in 2012/13. The proportion of year 12 leavers who were NEET was 2% compared to our target of 1.95%, which mirrored our performance in 2012/13. The proportion of year 13 leavers in 2013/14 who were NEET was 4.8% compared to our target of 3.9% and our 2012/13 performance of 4.4%.
- ▶ The annual destination data is a snapshot of student destinations in October. Analysis of data provided through the WG 5 tier model in which tiers 1–3 are NEET, shows that good progress has been made in engaging young people between April 2013 and March 2014:

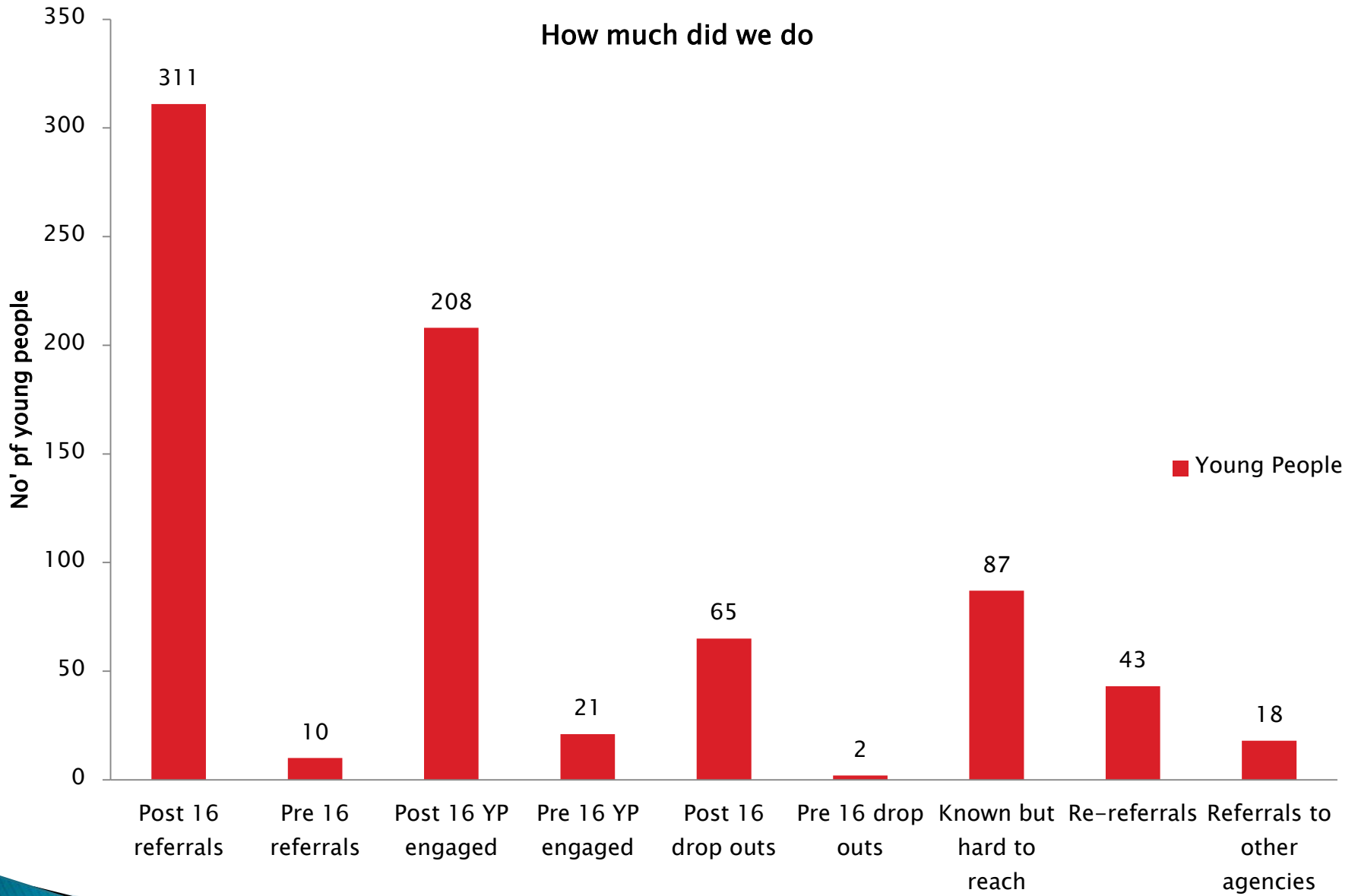

What have we done this year

- ▶ Numbers of NEET young people referred to EET : 323 young people referred
- ▶ Number of YP progression into EET: 120 Young people,
- ▶ Numbers of YP dropping out EET: 67 dropped out
- ▶ Percentage of NEET YP achieving accredited outcome 206 young people enrolled on courses and working towards qualification/accreditation. From this, 34 (17%) young people completed courses and gained qualification/accreditation
- ▶
- ▶ The graph below shows there were a total of 321 pre/post 16 referrals. 229 pre/ post 16 young people were engaged, of these 67 young people dropped out, however 43 were re-referrals, 18 were referred to other agencies and 12 counted as known but difficult to reach.
- ▶ Total of 206 young people were positively engaged.

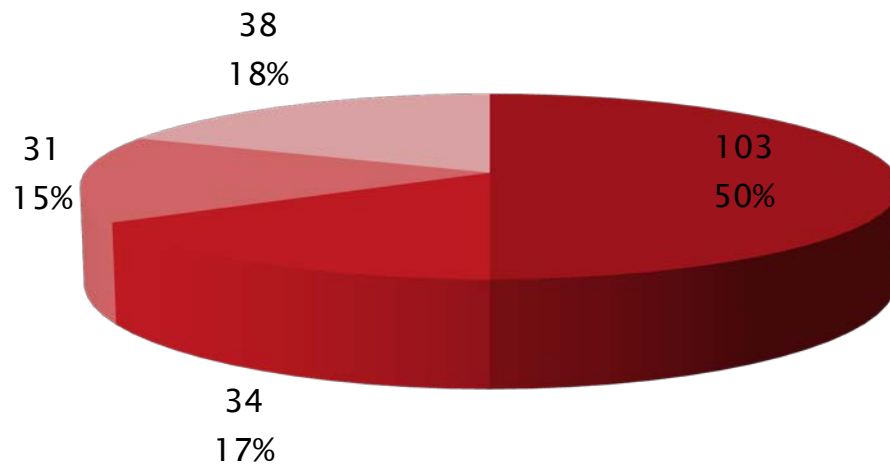
How much did we do



- ▶ Tier 1 (unknown) in April 2013 was 2.1% of 16–17 year olds and 3.7% of 18 year olds. In March 2014 unknowns had reduced to 1.12% and 1.3% respectively.
- ▶ Tier 2 (known but not able to be engaged) in April 2013 was 0.82% of 16 –17 year olds and 0.63% of 18 year olds. In March 2014 this stood at 0.67% and 1.23% respectively.
- ▶ Tier 3 (known and ready to engage) in April 2013 was 6.1% of 16–17 year olds and 5.93% of 18 year olds. In March 2014 this has reduced to 4.2% and 5.85% respectively.
- ▶ Tier 4 (engaged in 16 hours or less EET) in April 2013 was 1.6% of 16–17 year olds and 2.39% of 18 year olds. In March 2014 this had increased to 6.9% and 4.46% respectively.
- ▶ Tier 5 (fully engaged) in April 2013 was 89% of 16–17 year olds and 87% of 18 year olds. In March this stood at 87% for both age categories.

How well did we do it

- ▶ The sample population data indicates that a total of 206 young people were positively engaged. 103 (50%) were post 16 young people, enrolled on courses and or are working towards gaining accreditation. Half of these young people have been on their courses less than 3 months, and the other half between 6–12+ months.
- ▶ 34 (17%) of post 16 have completed their courses gaining qualifications/accreditations
- ▶ 31 (15%) of pre 16 are on prevocational courses/working towards gaining accreditation within the first quarter.
- ▶ 38 (18%) indicate Careers Wales tier 3 young people have positively progressed into tier 4 or 5 between April – June.
- ▶ 45 of the young people from the Vale are part of the ACT traineeship courses and working towards gaining qualification/accreditation.




■ No of post 16 enrolled on courses and or working towards gaining accreditation - less than 2 months

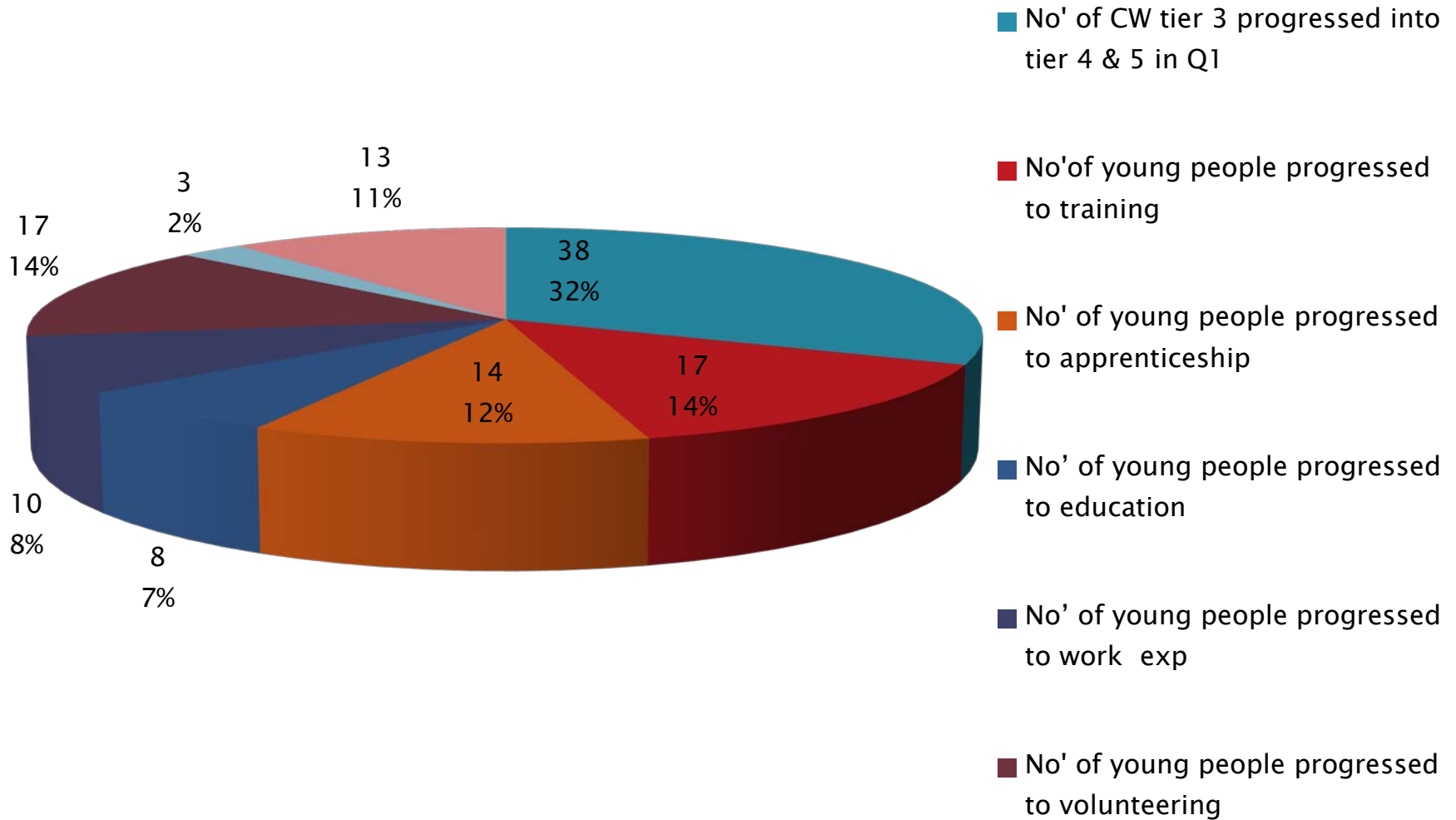
■ No' of post 16 who have successfully completed courses gaining qualification/accreditation

- 120 young people were better off in total
 - 38 (31%) are tier 3 who moved into tier 4 and 5

 - 17 (14%) progressed into volunteering, 14 (11%) into apprenticeship, 13 (10%) into employment, 10 (8%) into work experience, and 3 (2%) into TR&T
