

Camera status

- The full upgrade is nearing completion and is expected to be finalised in the next few months.
- 84 cameras and 10 re-deployable cameras.
- 63 in Barry, 2 in Cowbridge, 4 in Llantwit Major, 14 in Penarth & 1 in Rhoose.

New process'

- 24/7 monitoring by Cardiff Council.
- Operational Viewing suite at Barry Police Station

Synergy

- All cameras are being monitored on newly installed software, Synergy
- Re-deployable CCTV cameras are being integrated into Synergy to allow a more streamline approach.




