- 1.3 Applicants are advised that they are also able to attend the Standards Committee meeting to present their application if they wish to do so.



Nature of Dispensation sought	Dispensation to speak, vote and remain in meetings where issues are raised in respect of the Council's telecare services. I have Lasting Power of Attorney for my mother's affairs which includes arranging payment for her use of the telecare service.

I am seeking this dispensation because I consider my connection with the telecare service so tenuous to be irrelevant.</p>
<p>-- Relevant paragraph(s) under which dispensation can be granted (See (a) to (j) overleaf)</p>	<p>I refer you to the issues raised below but specifically (d), (e) (f)</p> <p>The Standards Committees (Grant of Dispensations) (Wales) Regulations 2001 specifies that the Council's Standards Committee may grant dispensations under Section 81 (4) of the Local Government Act 2000 Where:</p> <p><b>(d) the nature of the Member's interest is such that the Member's participation in the business to which the interest relates would not damage public confidence in the conduct of the Council's business;</b></p> <p>I consider that having responsibility for arranging the payment for services received by an elderly parent would arguably not be considered to be a prejudicial interest and that dispensation in this instance would not damage public confidence.</p> <p><b>The interest is common to the Member and a significant proportion of the general public;</b></p>

	<p>I consider this to be relevant as a significant number of people have elderly relatives who receive support from the Telecare service.</p> <p><b>The participation of the Member in the business to which the interest relates is justified by the Member’s particular role or expertise;</b></p> <p>The fees for telecare services is one line in an annual report that lists many services across a number of directorates including Country parks in my own portfolio.</p>
<p>Details of the Prejudicial Interest</p>	<p>I have lasting power of attorney for an elderly parent who uses the Council’s telecare service. I am responsible for arranging payment for the service.</p>

## Circumstances When A Standards Committee May Grant Dispensations

The Standards Committees (Grant of Dispensations) (Wales) Regulations 2001 specifies that the Council's Standards Committee may grant dispensations under Section 81 (4) of the Local Government Act 2000 where:

- a no fewer than half of the Members of the Council or of a committee of the Council (as the case may be) by which the business is to be considered has an interest which relates to that business;
- (b) no fewer than half of the Members of the Executive of the Council (i .e. Leader and Cabinet) by which the business is to be considered has an interest which relates to that business and either paragraph (d) or (e) also applies;
- (c) Members' inability to participate would upset the political balance of the Council, or any of its committees by which the business is to be considered, to such an extent that the outcome would be likely to be affected;
- (d) the nature of the Member's interest is such that the Member's participation in the business to which the interest relates would not damage public confidence in the conduct of the Council's business;
- e the interest is common to the Member and a significant proportion of the general public;
- (f) the participation of the Member in the business to which the interest relates is justified by the Member's particular role or expertise;
- (g) the registerable interest relates to business, which is to be considered by an Overview and Scrutiny Committee of the Council, and the Member's interest is not a pecuniary/financial interest;
- (h) the business relates to the finances or property of a voluntary organisation of whose management committee or board the Member is a member otherwise than as a representative of the Council and the Member has no other interest in that business, provided that any dispensation shall not extend to participation in any vote with respect to that business;
- (i) it appears to the Standards Committee to be in the interests of the inhabitants of the area of the Council that the disability should be removed; or
- (j) it appears to the Standards Committee to be otherwise appropriate to grant a dispensation. [If this circumstance is relied upon it will be required to be reviewed on a 12 month basis — Local Government (Standards Committees, Investigations, Dispensations and Referral) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2016 (3(1)A)]
