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#### **Executive Summary:**

- A revised budget of £41,963 has been set for issuing grants during 2023/24 reflecting allocations to date and proposed as part of this report.
- This includes an unallocated budget amount of £12,120 carried over from 2022/23 is also available for allocation during 2023/24.
- On a trial basis the maximum grant that can be potentially awarded has been increased from £5,000 to £10,000.
- Grants allocated at Committee in June 2023 totalled £10,150. Since that date, a grant awarded in the sum £5.000 has been withdrawn and substituted with a new application in Tranche 4.
   Therefore, reducing the total grants allocated at the June Committee to £5,150.
- Grants allocated at Committee in September 2023 totalled £13,813.
- Grants allocated at Committee in December 2023 totalled £3,000.
- Further awards totalling £20,000 are recommended as part of this report.

#### Recommendations

**1.** That Committee considers and approves the applications for grant assistance as set out in Appendix A of this report.

#### **Reasons for Recommendations**

1. In furtherance of the objectives of the Trust.

#### 1. Background

- 1.1 The Welsh Church Act Estate Committee has delegated authority to manage the trust's affairs in accordance with "The Scheme" the Welsh Church Act Estate as vested in the Council.
- 1.2 The purposes for which the Welsh Church Act fund may make grants is set out in summary at Appendix B to this report.
- **1.3** The applications received are set out in Appendix A to this report.

#### 2. Key Issues for Consideration

- 2.1 The revenue outturn for 2022/23 and the projections for 2023/24 are included in Appendix C. Income projections for 2023/24 assume that investment and rental income will be slightly reduced from 2022/23 which reflects the disruption and uncertainty regarding investment returns associated with the transfer to CCLA. Expenditure includes provision for Member training, valuation, and asset maintenance costs.
- The projections for 2023/24 include a sum of £12,120 which has been carried forward for grant allocation from 2022/23.
- 2.3 Tranche 1 of 2023/24 grant awards were approved by Committee in June 2023 as set out in the table below.

2.7 Croes Y Parc Baptist Church have withdrawn their application awarded in principle by the Trust in June 2023 (see Tranche 1) and put forward a new application for the Trust to consider at this February 2024 meeting. This is due to a change in circumstances that now requires an urgent solution. The subject of the June 2023 claim was for repairs to the boundary wall retaining the church burial ground. However, on the 28<sup>th of</sup> December 2023 the wall collapsed, now requiring it to be completely rebuilt at a much greater cost including additional costs of traffic management as the debris was blocking a road.

# 3. How do proposals evidence the Five Ways of Working and contribute to our Well-being Objectives?

3.1 The Trusts actions need to comply with Charity Law and its decisions are independent of the Councils obligations under the Well-Being of Future Generations Act.

#### 4. Resources and Legal Considerations

#### **Financial**

- 4.1 A sum of £10,150 was allocated as part of Tranche 1 for 2023/24 at the June 2023 Committee of which the application from Croes Y Parc Baptist Church has been withdrawn.
- **4.2** A sum of £13,813 was allocated as part of Tranche 2 for 2023/24 at the September 2023 Committee.
- 4.3 A sum of £3,000 was allocated as part of Tranche 3 for 2023/24 at the December 2023 Committee.
- 4.4 It is recommended that an allocation of £20,000 is made for applications for grant assistance as set out at Appendix A to this report.
- 4.5 The Welsh Church Act Fund retains an unrestricted fund to fund unforeseen costs associated with the maintenance of its investment properties the projected balance at year end as reflected in Appendix C to this report is £139,092.

The Community Council have agreed to cover the costs where the path continues and is not on Church land. Recommended by the Vale of Glamorgan Council £10,000.00 2 Croes y Parc Baptist Church Repair to Boundary Wall -The organisation made a previous application in Places of Worship and Burial Grounds £10,000.00 Total Project Cost £131,873 which includes a £10,000 contingency which is only payable if required. Financed by Benefact Registered Charity no 1203320 tranche 1 of this year for urgent financial assistance for repairs to the wall Grant £2,000, Welsh Church Act Grant (this application) £10,000 and Church funds £48,000 which are in place and have been verfied retaining church burial ground. This was approved for £5,000 in principle by a bank statement. Due to the urgent nature, the works are scheduled to commence on the 18th. March 2024 and the balance of the funding requirement is be be provided by 4 members of the Chapel in the form of interest free loans with repayments of circa £410 per pending approval of grants applied for with other organisations. Since that application the wall has actually collapsed on the 28th December 2023 and month over 15 years or until alternative funding can be arranged. Quote from Quantam Traffice Management £21,220, and RJL what repair work that was originaly planned is now not suitable and the costs Builders £98,153 included in application, the Vale of Glamorgan Council emergency traffic order and legal costs etc are not avalable at this time. Also in the application are the churches accounts as of December 2022 and the Church Handbook. of rebuild have increased as the whole 23 meters of the wall need to be replaced. In the circumstances the organisation wishes to withdraw their previous application and replace with the claim presented here. 3 4

# VALE OF GLAMORGAN COUNCIL WELSH CHURCH ACT FUND

#### WELSH CHURCH ACT ESTATE COMMITTEE

## The Charitable purposes for which the fund may be applied.

The Welsh Church Act Estate Committee has delegated authority to manage in accordance with "The Scheme" the Welsh Church Act Estate as vested in the Council.

Set out below is a **summary only** of the purposes for which the Fund may be applied:

- (i) **Educational** Provision of benefits not readily available from other sources, and recreation, social and physical training facilities, at educational establishments, not normally provided by the LEA.
- (ii) **Relief in sickness** Assistance to persons who are sick, convalescent, disabled, handicapped or infirm, where such assistance is not readily available from other sources.
- (iii) Relief in need Assistance generally or to individuals in need, hardship or distress.
- (iv) **Libraries, museums, art galleries etc.** Advancing the appreciation of Welsh arts and literature in general.
- (v) Social and recreational facilities in general.
- (vi) **Protection of historic buildings etc.** Promotion of interest in Welsh architecture, history and science in general, for the benefit of Welsh people.
- (vii) **Medical and social research, treatment in general etc.** Preservation and protection of the physical and mental health of society in general. Provision of nurseries, convalescent homes and hostels
- (viii) **Probation etc.** Assistance to persons on probation or the families thereof.
- (ix) **Blind persons** Provision of welfare including accommodation.
- (x) **Aged persons** Provision of accommodation.
- (xi) Places of worship and burial grounds Restoration and maintenance.
- (xii) **Emergencies or disasters** Directly assisting persons in need.
- (xiii) **Other charitable purposes** Contributions to charitable organisations not inconsistent with the purposes of the trust.

The above is a précis only of the wide ranging purposes to which the Welsh Church Act Fund may be applied, and in cases of doubt reference should be made to the actual provisions of the scheme document.
