<p>Executive Summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The land edged red in Appendix A (0.9 acres) is owned by the Welsh Church Act Estate and has been unused for many years and become overgrown in areas and will be an ongoing maintenance liability for the Trust.</li> <li>A Community Orchard proposal was considered by the Trust previously but did not progress as the applicants withdrew from the process.</li> <li>On the instructions of Committee, officers have undertaken further research from looking at the history of the site from the deed packet documents and have consulted with both the Planning and Highways teams for their initial observations.</li> <li>The detail relating to this is set out in the Part II report on this agenda.</li> </ul>

## **1. Background**

- 1.1 The Trust owns a parcel of land shown edged red on the plan attached at Appendix A, which is located near St Oswald's Rd, Cadoxton, Barry. The land, measuring 0.9 acres, has been unused and has become overgrown in places.
- 1.2 A proposal was submitted previously relating to a Community Orchard project which has since been withdrawn by the applicants.
- 1.3 Officers were requested by Committee to undertake some further research relating to the site. The detail of that investigation is set out in the Part II report on this agenda.
